COUNCIL REPORTS:

Borough Attorney Rizzo Esq. - reported progress.

<u>Administrator Cullen</u> – pointed out that ordinance 2092 that was adopted this evening for air packs will be paid 90% by a FEMA grant. Also the resolution regarding PUMA is for as-needed over flow services only. The added and omitted bills are in the process of going out. Mr. Cullen concluded by congratulating Councilman Bengivenga on his upcoming marriage.

<u>Engineer Miller</u> – advised that the work on Rio Street is now complete and the drainage work on Belmont is done and the concrete work should begin this week. The milling and paving should begin next week. Councilman Bengivenga said he spoke to Lt. DeLair regarding the issues on Garden Drive and it issue was determined to install speed humps.

<u>Clerk Antonides</u> – Clerk Antonides reminded everyone of the poll worker training class scheduled on Tuesday, October 17th at 7:00 p.m. at the Senior Center.

<u>Councilman Dean</u> – inquired what the speed report outcome was on Garden Drive. Councilman Bengivenga said the average was 25-30 mph so it was not a speeding issue but more of a volume issue instead. Councilman Dean mentioned his concerns regarding posting signs or a rail fence barricade up at Veteran's Park to prevent vehicles from accelerating forward by accident. Mr. Cullen advised that we will begin with posting signage first. Mr. Miller said the signs will go up tomorrow.

Councilman Dean on behalf of Montgomery Township thanked the South Plainfield Police Department for the use of their K9's in regards to a missing child. To conclude Councilman Dean suggested that the Council spit up their attendance on Veteran's Day to go to the different schools.

<u>Councilwoman Faustini</u> – said that the dog park is looking good and should be ready by this weekend. Three adaptive swings from the Elks have been delivered and will be installed. The lights are finally up and running at the Pal. Councilwoman Faustini concluded by wishing Councilman Dean a happy birthday.

<u>Councilman Bengivenga</u> – Regarding the crossing at New Brunswick Avenue Conrail has advised they will begin to repair it around the 23^{rd} weather permitting.

<u>Councilman Vesce</u> – updated the status of the Do Not Block requests. We were able to accommodate one of the requests which has been taken care of.

<u>Councilman Wolak</u> – said he is very happy that speed humps will be put in on Garden Drive. The DPW is distributing 1,000 flags along with leaf bags to residents that were donated on a first come first serve basis. They were donated by the American Legion and Elks.

<u>Council President White</u> - reported progress.

<u>Mayor Anesh</u> – reported on the success of the recent Mayor's Wellness Health Fair, the Fire Department Open House and the Library Fall Festival. It was a busy day in South Plainfield that we refer to as "Super Saturday". One of the highlights was the K9 demo.

COMMENTS FROM THE PUBLIC:

Mayor Anesh opened the floor for public comment.

Debbie Boyle of Van Fleet reminded everyone of various events forthcoming throughout South Plainfield from October through December. Such events are posted on the Borough website.

Darlene Cullen of Fox Place thanked the Mayor and Council for attending the Library's Fall Festival saying next year we are going to look for a Tin Man. Mrs. Cullen advised that the Library will be having a protective guard rail installed at Willow Park within the next couple weeks

Mr. Ben Macowski of 605 Maple Avenue thanked the Council for making the health fair possible and was pleased to hear that South Plainfield has the second lowest taxes in the county. To conclude he expressed how taxes do impact renters.

Mr. Tom Turner of 313 West 9th Street asked why he is discriminated against regarding salary in his capacity as a computer instructor at the Senior Center. Mr. Cullen said he doesn't recall Mr. Turner ever coming to him about this matter and it's the first he's hearing of it. Mr. Turner said all he's heard is one excuse after another and wants to know what the Council is going to do about it. Councilman Bengivenga said he needs to schedule an appointment for a meeting with the liaison(s) to the Senior Center.

Ms. Libby Barkowski of 452 Jones Street inquired about the By-Laws of the Municipal Alliance. Mayor Anesh explained.

With no further comments from the public, Mayor Anesh closed the floor. At 7:47 p.m. Mayor Anesh called for a recess from the public portion of the meeting to go into Executive Session advising that everyone is welcome to stay if they choose.

Upon return from Executive Session at 8:16 p.m., Mayor Anesh called the public meeting back to order saying the results of this evenings Executive Session resulted in no new additional items and called for a motion to adjourn.

ADJOURNMENT

Without further comment and no more action necessary for this evening, Mayor Anesh called for a motion to adjourn. Councilman Bengivenga made a motion to adjourn at 8:17 p.m., seconded by Councilman Wolak and unanimously carried. The meeting was adjourned.
