ORDINANCE #2175

CALENDAR YEAR 2020 ORDINANCE TO EXCEED THE MUNICIPAL BUDGET COST OF LIVING ALLOWANCE AND TO ESTABLISH A CAP BANK PURSUANT TO N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.14

WHEREAS, the Local Government Cap Law, N.J.S. A. 40A:4-45.1 *et seq.*, provides that in the preparation of its annual budget, a municipality shall limit any increase in said budget to 2.5% unless authorized by ordinance to increase it to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, subject to certain exceptions; and,

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.15a provides that a municipality may, when authorized by ordinance, appropriate the difference between the amount of its actual final appropriation and the 3.5% percentage rate as an exception to its final appropriations in either of

the next two succeeding years; and,

WHEREAS, the Borough Council of the Borough of South Plainfield find it advisable and necessary to increase its CY 2020 budget by up to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, in the interest of promoting the health, safety and welfare of its citizens; and,

WHEREAS, the Borough Council hereby determines that a 3.5% increase in the budget for said year, amounting to \$862,510.25 in excess of the increase in final appropriations otherwise permitted by the Local Government Cap Law, is advisable and necessary; and,

WHEREAS, the Borough Council hereby determines that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED, by the Borough Council of the Borough of South Plainfield, in the County of Middlesex, a majority of the full authorized membership of this governing body affirmatively concurring, that, in the 2020 budget year, the final appropriations of the Borough of South Plainfield shall, in accordance with this ordinance and N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.14, be increased by 3.5% amounting to \$862,510.25 and that the 2020 municipal budget for the Borough of South Plainfield be approved and adopted in accordance with this ordinance; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that a certified copy of this ordinance as introduced be filed with the Director of the Division of Local Government Services within 5 days of introduction; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that a certified copy of this ordinance upon adoption, with the recorded vote included thereon, be filed with said Director within 5 days after such adoption.

BUDGET RESOLUTIONS:

Mr. Cullen briefed the Governing Body on the status of the introduced budget. Mr. Cullen advised that some time ago he had mentioned that the Borough would be significantly fiscally impacted by COVID-19. We have done a lot of things from an expense standpoint about furloughing some staff. The budget itself is up roughly \$325,000.00 from a year ago which is only 1%. So, from a spending perspective we have been able to keep things in check. We have, however, suffered a significant loss in revenues. We have a \$300,000.00 reduction in surplus, a \$253,000.00 reduction in Building Department fees, Hotel Tax is down almost \$125,000.00, and our Court revenue is down almost \$104,000.00. The introduced budget right now has a \$111.90 increase. Just in loss of revenues that is \$60.00 of the \$111.90. Our Debt Service is up \$21.50. The required employee contributions is up another \$11.50. Recycling is up \$134,000.00 which is another \$10.00. When you add all that up you come to \$111.90. There are still a lot of unknowns right now. There are unknows with some of the legislation, specifically the ability to furlough staff. We are looking at various mechanisms to save some dollars. I am not sure how much better the budget introduction will be by the time we adopt. The state has not come out with their aid number yet. We will be looking at any more changes we can make by the time of the budget adoption and see what the legislature comes out with to assist municipalities. We will have a special meeting on June 29th for a public hearing on the budget and anticipate adopting the budget at our July 13th meeting. There is just a lot of variables in this process.

Councilman Bengivenga reiterated what Mr. Cullen said. We have been looking closely at this for the past two months. We saw revenues were getting worse and worse. We did put certain things in place to save us on salaries and wages. If you look at the budget municipal salaries are up less than 1% year after year and the entire budget is up only 1%, it's only the revenue side that we are hurting on. We are hoping for some legislation to help put us to be in a better position and obviously opening up things will help. Councilman Bengivenga said he doesn't know how much better it will get, especially with the court. There's going to need to be a lot of catch-up that will have to be made. The budget that we introduce tonight is a good starting point. Credit goes to the Mayor and Mr. Cullen who put things in place so our situation wouldn't be worse than it is. Everyone in this state is experiencing the effects of this. Governor Murphy said there is a \$10 billion shortfall he anticipates. Because we were very proactive in the beginning that's why we

are where we are today. Councilman Bengivenga concluded by saying he looks forward to working with everyone over the next two months to see how we can improve upon this.

Mayor Anesh said there have been a few positive developments recently. Last week the Governor came out with an executive order to begin all non-essential construction and all non-essential retail establishments can open for curbside pick-up. We do have some large building projects in town taking place like LA Fitness. Hopefully in the coming days we will see an even better picture. It will be a slow crawl back to normalcy. Even when things start to open again certain revenues will be slow to come. The last thing we want to see is a high unemployment rate which will obviously affect all our residents and residents throughout the state. This is a tough challenge to face and the biggest one we've had in at least a decade. There's been a lot of smart budgeting and cost effectiveness taking place. Mr. Cullen watches every penny. There is no bullet proof solution to this, and municipalities are all in the same boat. Legislators are all looking for aid to the municipalities to help offset the loss in revenues.

Council President Faustini thanked everyone for all their hard work on this budget. Mr. Cullen reiterated that the public hearing for the budget will be at a special meeting on June 29th, with adoption date of July 13th.

COUNCIL REPORTS:

Borough Attorney Paul Rizzo - reported progress.

<u>Administrator Cullen</u> – agreed with Mayor Anesh that this isn't a new normal it will be just slow to get back to normal. We are going to do everything we can to keep costs down and look for any revenue opportunities.

<u>Engineer Miller</u> – reported that the road projects are underway. The road project for St. Nicholas we are currently out to bid for which will be funded all by a DOT grant.

<u>Clerk Antonides</u> – reported progress.

<u>Councilman Wolak</u> – expressed that he was glad to see the police proclamation this evening. Councilman Wolak thanked Mr. Cullen and Councilman Bengivenga for all their work they did on the budget. To conclude Councilman Wolak said he looks forward to and hopes to hear some good news in the coming days that a vaccine has been found. We're all due to hear some good news.

Councilman White – Asked to keep all of our first responders in our prayers as we continue to fight the COVID-19 battle. Councilman White thanked the Hometown Hero Banner Committee. There were 62 applications received and 62 banners will be displayed by July 1st. At 10:00 a.m. on Monday, Memorial Day, all are encouraged to step outside their homes and recite the pledge of allegiance or play the Star Spangled Banner to honor all those who have sacrificed their lives for our country. Councilman Bengivenga interjected saying that this week is also EMS Week and we thank them for all that they do. Hats off to them as always.

<u>Councilman Smith</u> – thanked Mr. Cullen and Councilman Bengivenga for their dedication and hard work on the budget. Councilman Smith went on to also thank Mr. Miller and Mr. Rizzo for their continuing work in the Borough behind the scenes particularly with the DPW. Also regarding Police Week, we need to congratulate and thank all our fine officers and first responders for the work they do in keeping our community safe. We pray we continue to be a strong community.

Councilwoman Mott - reported progress.

Councilman Bengivenga – reported progress and noted that his father has made it back to New Jersey and is doing well.

<u>Council President Faustini</u> – thanked all those who donated food to our seniors. The Senior Center still has masks available for curbside pick-up. The liner around the big pool should be put in next week and the fixtures were installed today. There have been delays on the pool construction due to COVID-19. We still hope to be ready to open the pool maybe around July 1st, but it does depend on what the Governor will allow. We are also still unsure of the Labor Day Parade. We will still hold the fireworks, as that can be a socially distant event. We will be moving forward with that, however, we ae planning to have them on Saturday, September 5th instead of the night of Labor Day as it is a significant savings to the Borough to do that. On another note, recreation refunds for cancelled programs are scheduled to be sent out this week.

Mayor Anesh – noted that for the first time Mr. Cullen put out a notice that there were no new COVID-19 cases this week. As of tonight, there were two additional cases bringing the total to 483. At our prior council meeting we passed a Light the Fight Resolution asking residents to join in. We rescheduled the candle lighting at the school from last Thursday evening to this Thursday evening. Mayor Anesh emphasized that this will be a drive by event only. Walk-byes are highly discouraged. The lights will probably remain on until around 9:30-10 p.m. Mayor Anesh asked Ms. Antonides about the status of the Primary Election. Ms. Antonides responded by saying that the Primary Election has been moved to July 7th. Some determination still has yet to be made as to exactly how many polling location(s) will be available. The Governor's Executive Order said that there is to be a minimum of at least one polling location in each municipality, however, votes are to be provisional only, with an exception of allowing machine use for only ADA assessible needs. Ms. Antonides advised that she hopes to learn more via a conference call later this week with the County Board of Elections. Councilman White asked what the procedure will be if someone were to accidently throw away their live ballot that they received in the mail. Ms. Antonides said she will ask the County Board of Elections and get back to him with that answer.

COMMENTS FROM THE PUBLIC:

Mayor Anesh opened the floor for public comment.

Debbie Boyle of Van Fleet extended blessings to everyone and went on to ask Councilman White about the Hometown Hero banners.

Suzanne Lepore of Bullard Place on behalf of the Cultural Arts Commission thanked everyone for sharing their photos for the monthly photo contest. Please continue to share the photos with the community. Ms. Lepore asked about the PSE&G resurfacing project. Councilman Bengivenga said that due to COVID-19 the project has been delayed but we will negotiate with them on the resurfacing in the future.

Without any further comment from the public, Mayor Anesh closed the floor.

ADJOURNMENT

Without further comment and no more action necessary for this evening Mayor Anesh called for a motion to adjourn. Councilman Smith made a motion to adjourn at 7:54 p.m., seconded by Councilman White and unanimously carried. The meeting was adjourned.
