 - A. That the maximum estimated amount of money to be raised from all sources for the purposes stated in Section 1, hereof, is \$170,000.00. Improvements shall include, but not be limited to, Patrol Vehicles and Landfill Engineering costs.
 - B. That the cost for the improvements shall be paid from Capital Improvements Fund totaling \$170,000.00.
 - C. The estimated useful life of said improvements is hereby determined to be five (5) years.
- Section 4. That the total amount of the appropriation to be expended for Architectural and inspection costs, legal costs, advertisement of ordinance and other expenses as provided in Section 48:2-20 of the Revised Statutes, is not to exceed \$44,500.00.
- Section 5. This ordinance shall take effect after final passage and publication in accordance with the law.

ORDINANCE # 2348 CALENDAR YEAR 2025 ORDINANCE TO EXCEED THE MUNICIPAL BUDGET COST OF LIVING ALLOWANCE AND TO ESTABLISH A CAP BANK PURSUANT TO N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.14

WHEREAS, the Local Government Cap Law, N.J.S. 40A: 4-45.1 et seq., provides that in the preparation of its annual budget, a municipality shall limit any increase in said budget up to 2.5% unless authorized by ordinance to increase it to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, subject to certain exceptions; and,

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.15a provides that a municipality may, when authorized by ordinance, appropriate the difference between the amount of its actual final appropriation and the 3.5% percentage rate as an exception to its final appropriations in either of the next two succeeding years; and,

WHEREAS, the Borough Council of the Borough of South Plainfield in the County of Middlesex finds it advisable and necessary to increase its CY 2024 budget by up to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, in the interest of promoting the health, safety and welfare of the citizens; and,

WHEREAS, the Borough Council hereby determines that a 3.5% increase in the budget for said year, amounting to \$1,093,894.43 in excess of the increase in final appropriations otherwise permitted by the Local Government Cap Law, is advisable and necessary; and,

WHEREAS the Borough Council of the Borough of South Plainfield hereby determines that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED, by the Borough Council of the Borough of South Plainfield, in the County of Middlesex, a majority of the full authorized membership of this governing body affirmatively concurring, that, in the CY 2025 budget year, the final appropriations of the Borough of South Plainfield shall, in accordance with this ordinance and N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.14, be increased by 3.5 %, amounting to \$1,093,894.43, and that the CY

2025 municipal budget for the Borough of South Plainfield be approved and adopted in accordance with this ordinance; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that a certified copy of this ordinance as introduced be filed with the Director of the Division of Local Government Services within 5 days of introduction; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that a certified copy of this ordinance upon adoption, with the recorded vote included thereon, be filed with said Director within 5 days after such adoption.

WHEREAS, N.J.A.C. 5:30-7 was adopted by the Local Finance Board on February 11, 1997; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to N.J.A.C. 5:30-7.2 through 7.5, the Borough of South Plainfield has been declared eligible to participate in the program by the Division of Local Government Services, and the Chief Financial officer has determined that the local government meets the necessary conditions to participate in the program for the 2025 budget year.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the governing body of the Borough of South Plainfield that in accordance with N.J.A.C. 5:30-7.6a & 7.6b and based upon the Chief Financial Officer's certification, the governing body has found the budget has met the following requirements:

- 1. That with reference to the following items, the amounts have been calculated pursuant to law and appropriated as such in the budget:
 - a. Payment of interest and debt redemption charges
 - b. Deferred charges and statutory expenditures
 - c. Cash deficit of preceding year
 - d. Reserve for uncollected taxes
 - e. Other reserves and non-disbursement items
 - f. Any inclusions of amounts required for school purposes.
- 2. That the provisions relating to limitation on increases of appropriations pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.2 and appropriations for exceptions to limits on appropriations found at N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.3 et seq., are fully met (complies with CAP law).

- 3. That the budget is in such form, arrangement, and content as required by the Local Budget Law and N.J.A.C. 5:30-4 and 5:30-5.
- 4. That pursuant to the Local Budget Law:
 - a. All estimates of revenue are reasonable, accurate and correctly stated,
 - b. Items of appropriation are properly set forth
 - c. In itemization, form, arrangement and content, the budget will permit the exercise of the comptroller function within the municipality.
- 5. The budget and associated amendments have been introduced and publicly advertised in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Local Budget Law, except that failure to meet the deadlines of N.J.S.A. 40A:4-5 shall not prevent such certification.
- 6. That all other applicable statutory requirements have been fulfilled.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this resolution will be forwarded to the Director of the Division of Local Government Services upon adoption.

<u>Chief Papa</u> – indicated that the water company project on Oaktree Avenue will be moving to nighttime hours after the project passes the Putnam Park area which will allow for better traffic flow during the day and asked if the Council has any concerns. Mr. Miller said he has spoken to Mr. Cullen about it already and we don't see a problem with it since it will not affect the residential portion of Oaktree Avenue. On another note, the Fishing Derby is on May 3rd, and we have about 150 registrants so far and are allowing room for more registrants.

<u>Councilwoman Mott</u> – reminded everyone that the spring clean-up day is scheduled for this Saturday, April 26th. Sign-ups for that are taking place. The starting point will be at Borough Hall.

Councilman Smith - was absent this evening.

<u>Councilwoman Faustini</u> – the registration for spring youth programs are open. There is multisport, junior field hockey, stem, soccer and tennis. We also have a number of adult programs available which are shown on the recreation website. The summer sport camps, and summer parks registration will be open soon. The early bird community pool pricing will be completed on May 1st.

Councilman Wolak - was absent this evening.

<u>Council President White</u> – reported that Sips N Souls Café will be opening soon on Hamiliton Blvd, located next to Scoop To My Lou and went on to report progress.

<u>Councilman Bengivenga</u> – provided an explanation of the Index Rate Ordinance that is on tonight's agenda, saying that we don't typically have to use it. It is only used for emergent situations such as Hurricane Sandy.

Mayor Anesh – reported progress.

Mayor Anesh announced (at 7:20 p.m.) that with no further business necessary this evening, the Council will go into an Executive Session of which no further action is anticipated to be taken this evening.

ADJOURNMENT

Without further comment and no more action necessary for this evening Mayor Anesh called for a motion to adjourn. Councilman Bengivenga made a motion to adjourn at 7:31 p.m., seconded by Council President White and unanimously carried. The meeting was adjourned.
